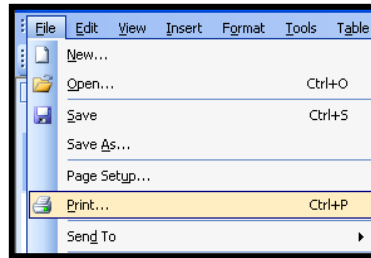

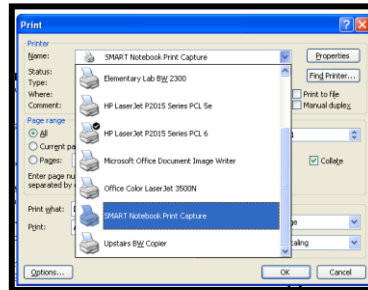
### FROM WORD TO SMARTBOARD

Open the Word Document

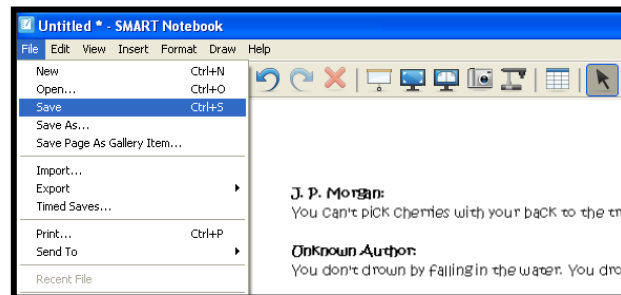
- File

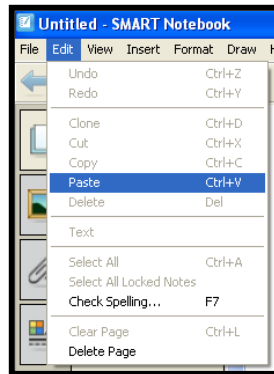

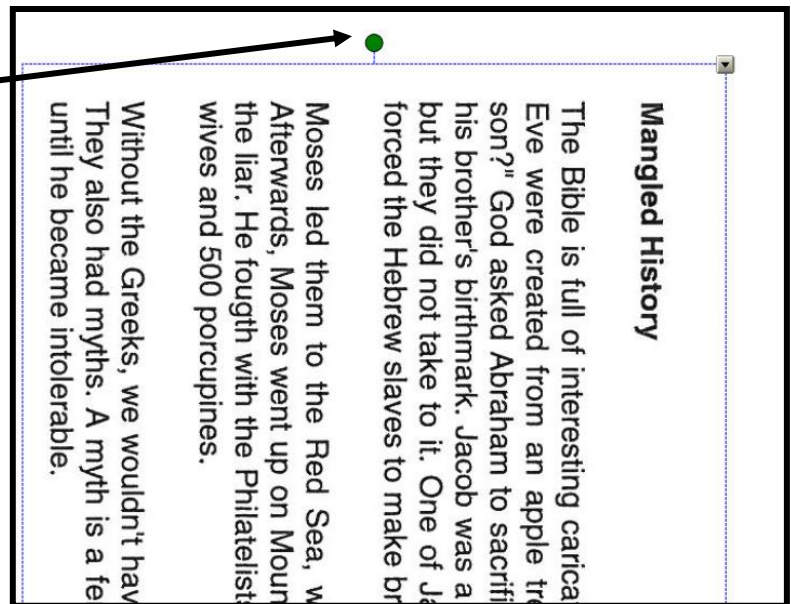

- The green circle will rotate the object

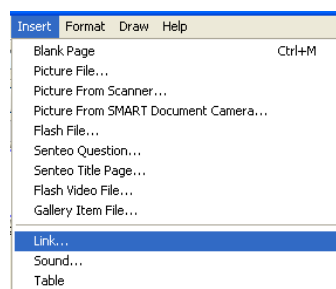
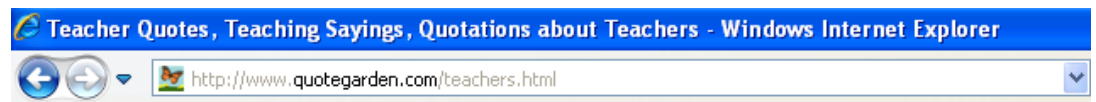

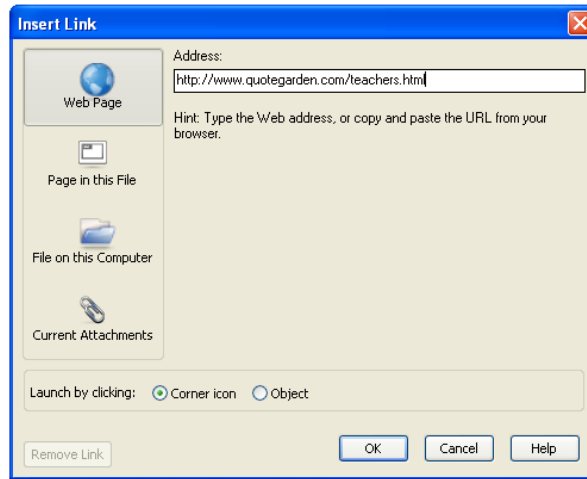
