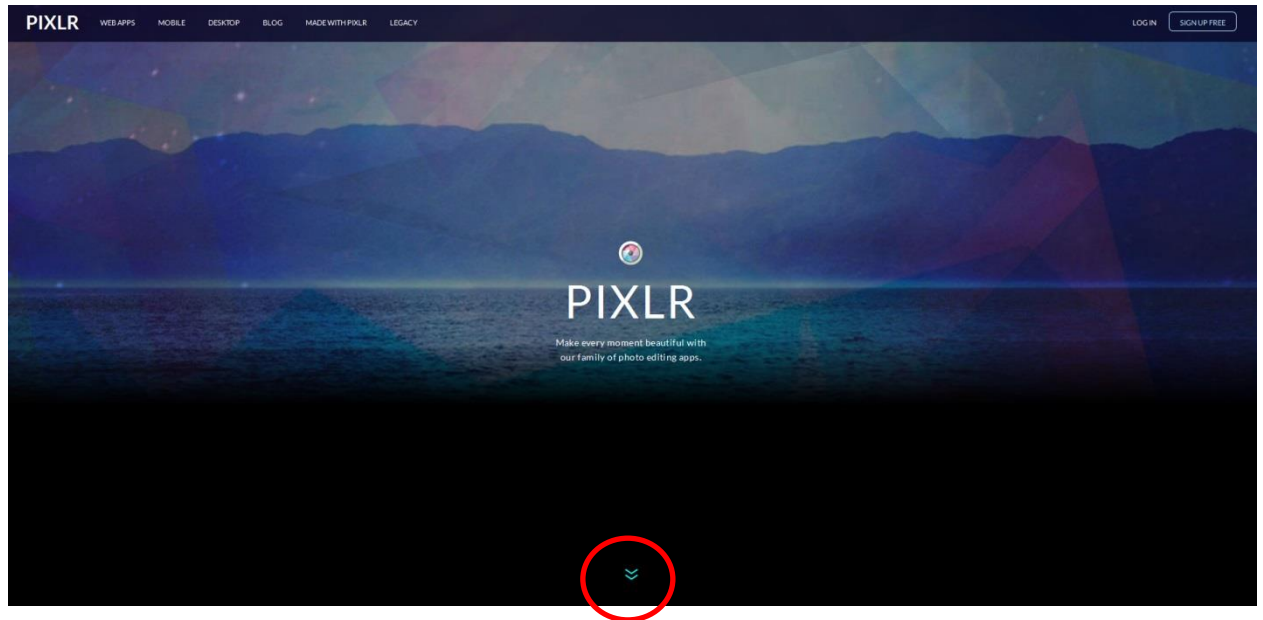


USING A GREEN SCREEN TO CREATE ON PHOTO OUT OF MULTIPLES

Note – there are many uses of this technology that are unethical at best and illegal at worst.

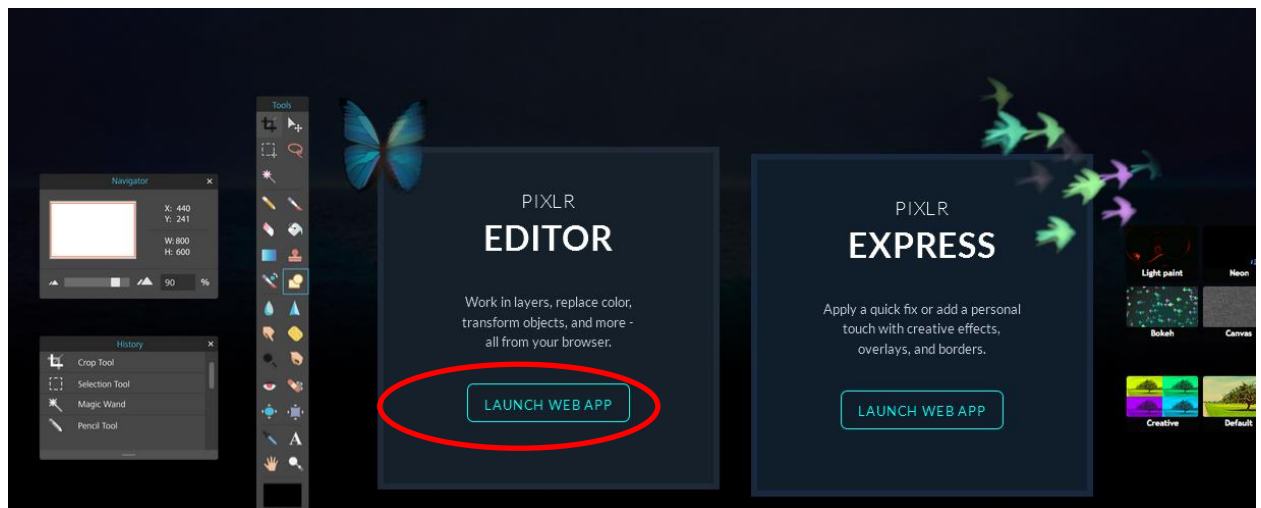
Be sure: the subjects of the photo know they are being photographed. The combined photos are not intended to harm anyone or any place depicted.

1. Take a photo of your foreground in front of a green screen or other simple one-color background.
2. Take a photo of your background.
3. Open <https://pixlr.com/>

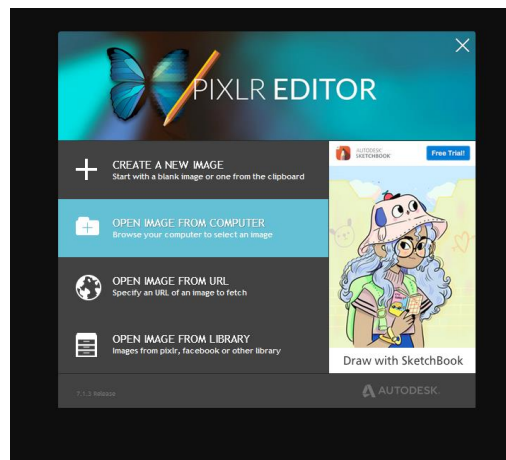


4. Click the Down-Arrows

5. Choose the Pixlr Editor – Web App



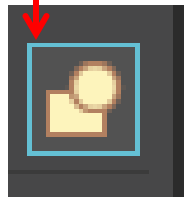
6. Choose Open Image from Computer



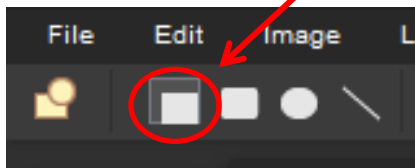
7. Open your foreground picture

8. Cover your background as much as possible with rectangles of the green screen color.

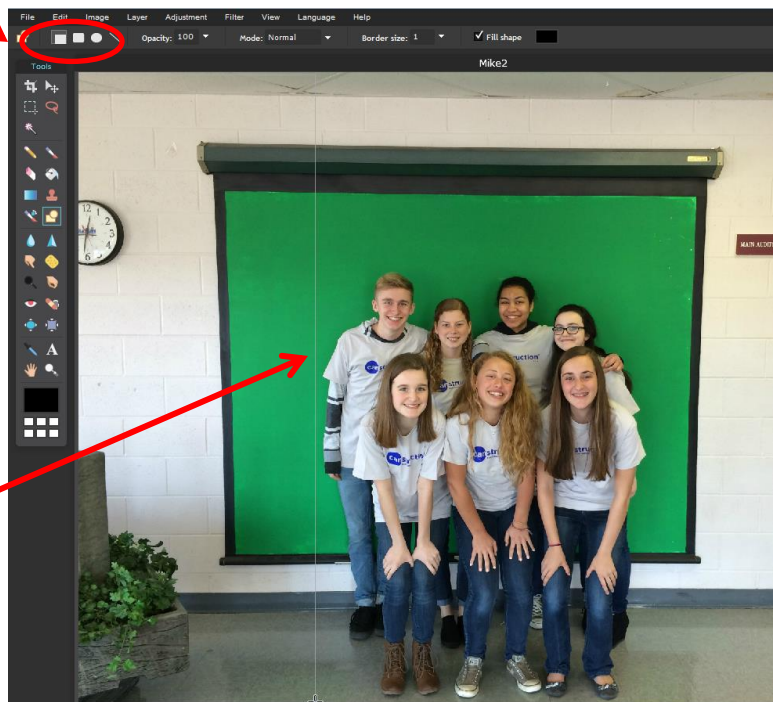
9. Click the shape tool



10. Choose the rectangle shape

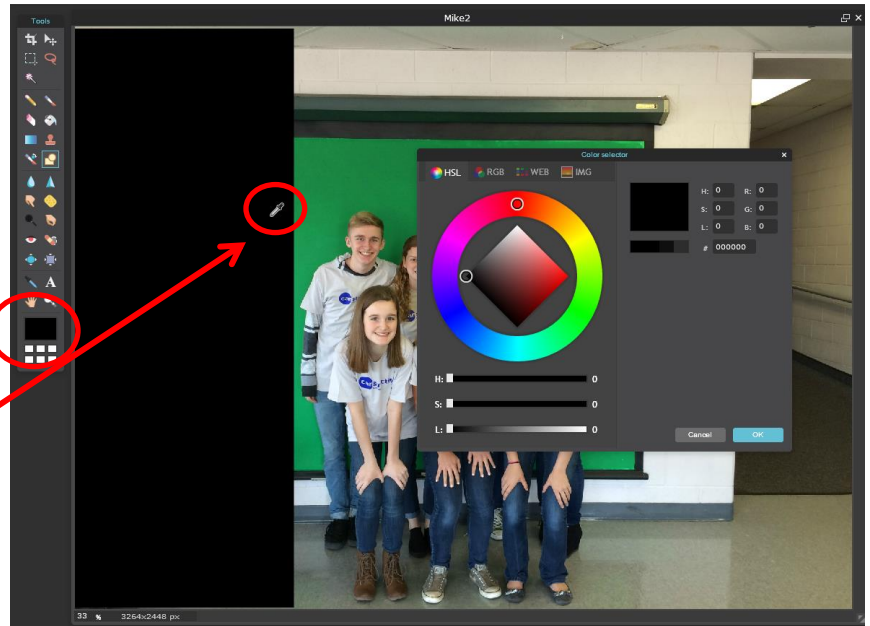


11. Place your cursor on a corner of your picture and drag until you just touch the part you want to keep. It will make a faint box where the box will go.



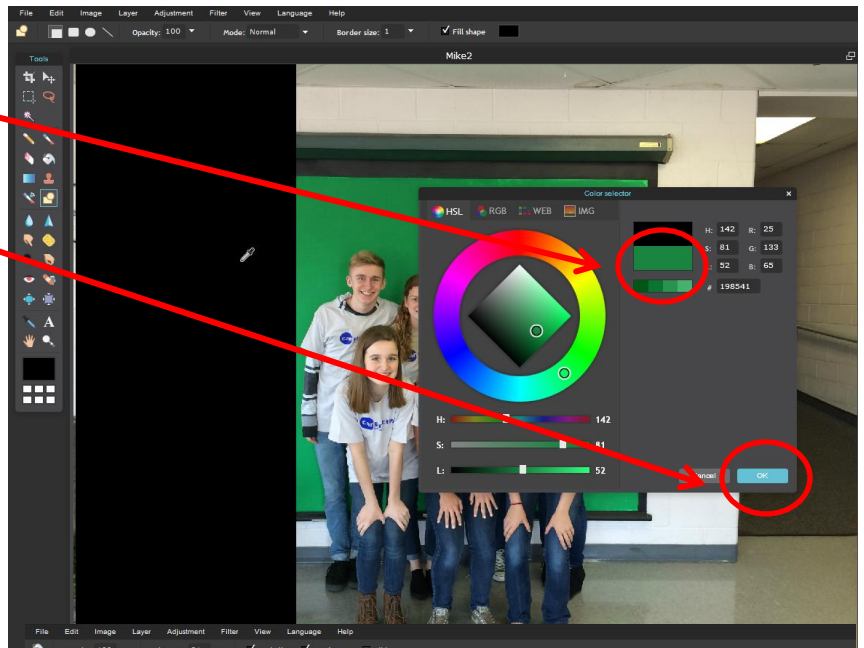
12. The box will default to black – to change it click on the black box

13. Drag the medicine dropper to the green screen



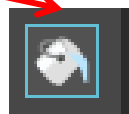
14. Check the green color in the box

15. If it is correct, Click OK

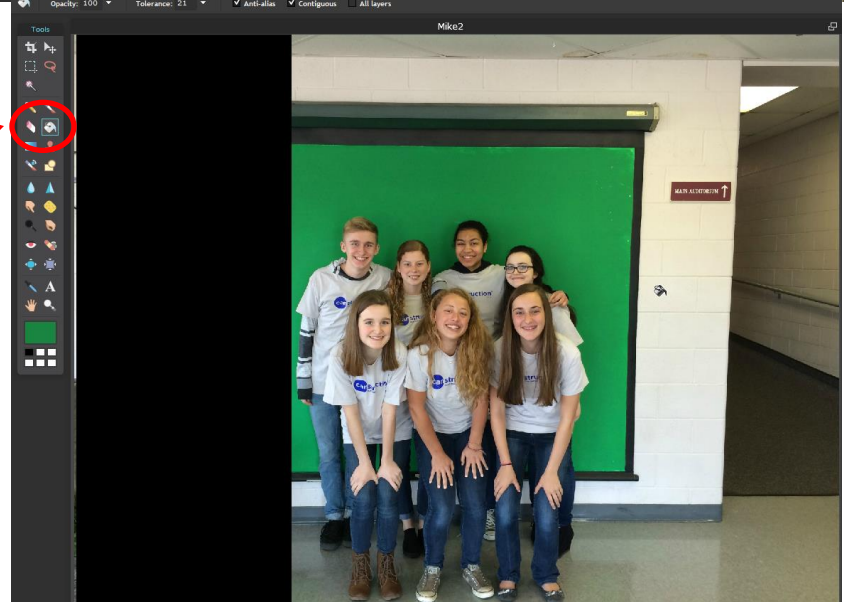


16. The black box is now green

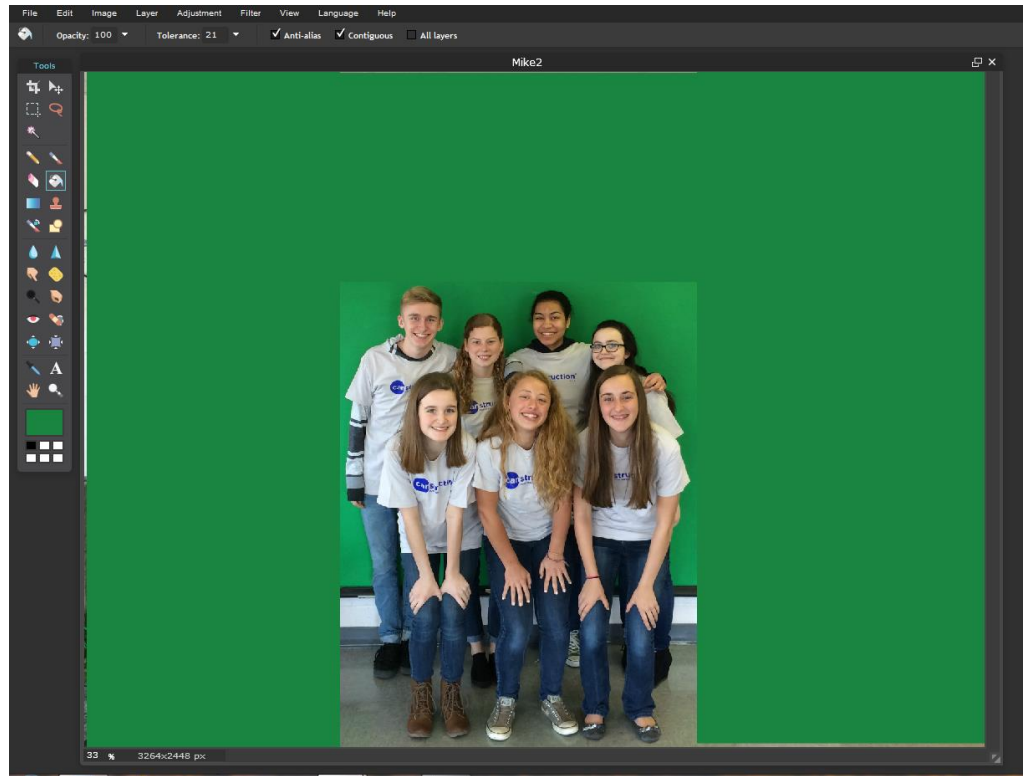
17. Choose the fill tool



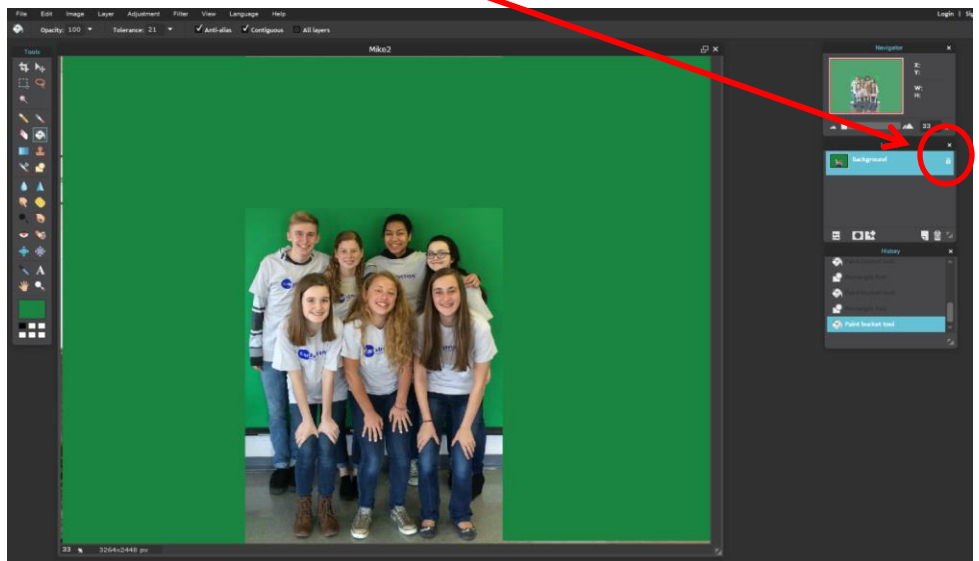
18. Click anywhere in the black box wait for it to turn green



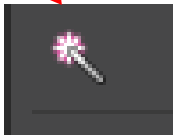
19. Repeat that process until the photo is as covered with green as much as possible.



20. In the Pixlr Layer tool on the right – Double-click the lock on Background layer. A little check mark will appear. This allows you to make changes to the background.

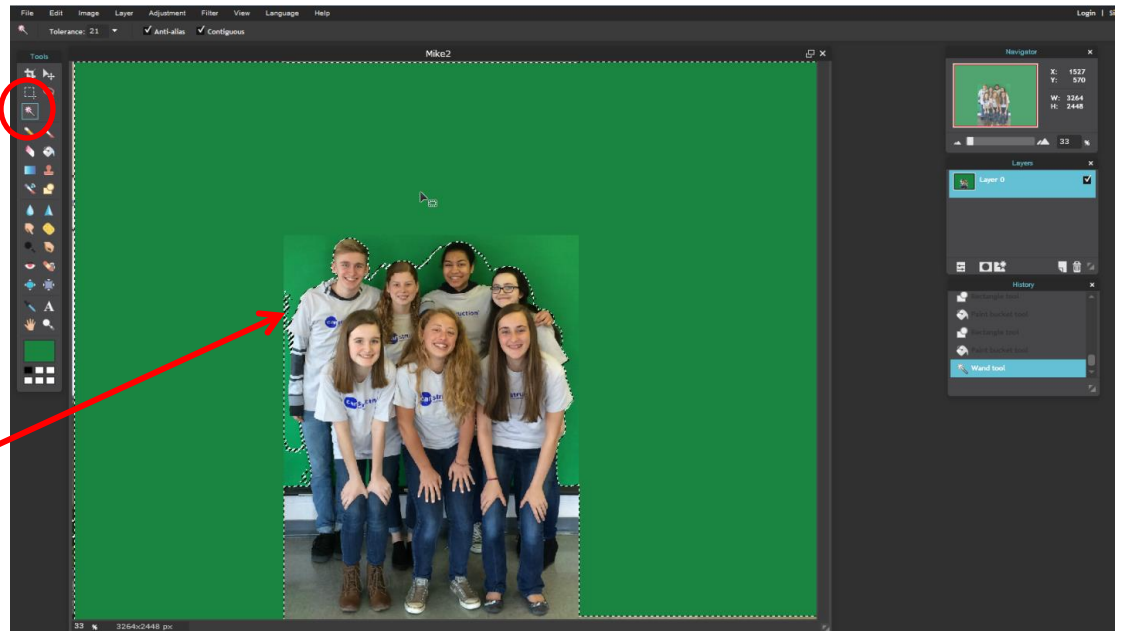


21. Click the Magic Wand Tool



22. Click any green

23. The boundaries will show as a dashed line. Check that they are where you want them.

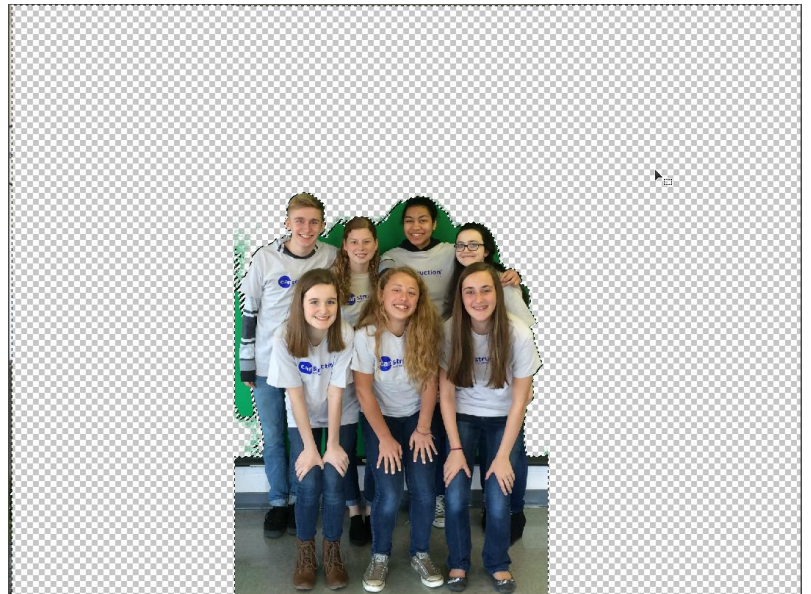


24. Click Delete Button

The Green will disappear. If it is white instead of checkered, the lock is still on the background layer.

25. Now you use the magic wand to clear the other colors you don't want.

Be very careful that the magic wand doesn't see part of your photo as background each time you change color.



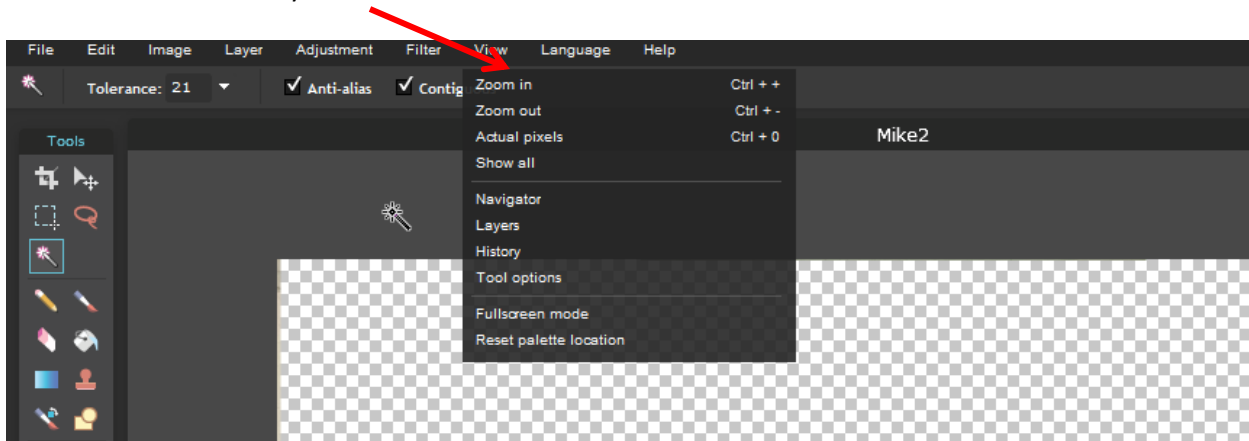
If it looks like this, it will delete the jeans along with the background. Just click out of the selected area and try again.

If you delete something you still want, Ctrl Z or Command Z will undo it.

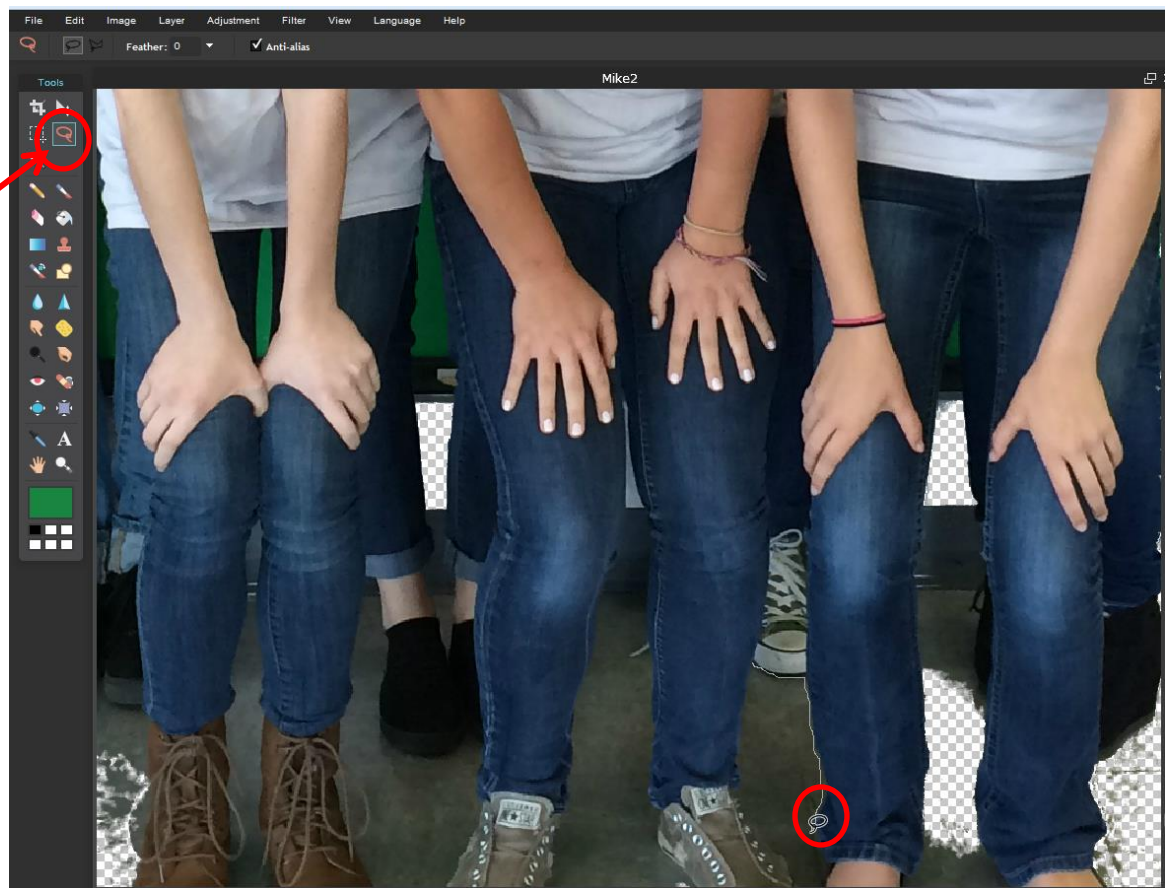


When you reach the place where nothing else can be mass-deleted. The rest is done by hand:

26. Zoom in as close as you like – View - Zoom in



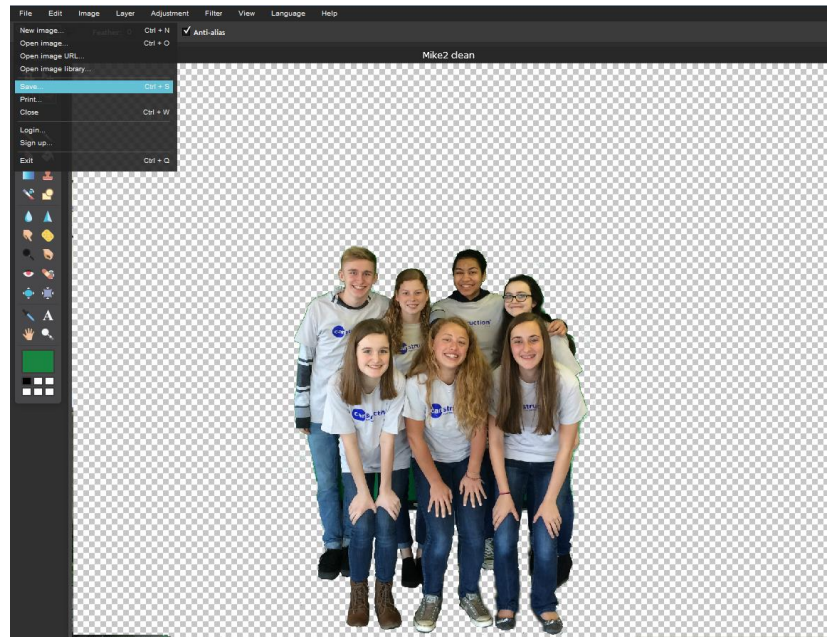
27. Use the lasso tool to choose your areas you want deleted.



28. Click and Drag the tool along the edge of the area. It will leave a faint trail.

29. Click the delete button when it is where you want it.

30. When your foreground is the way you want it, Click File – Save

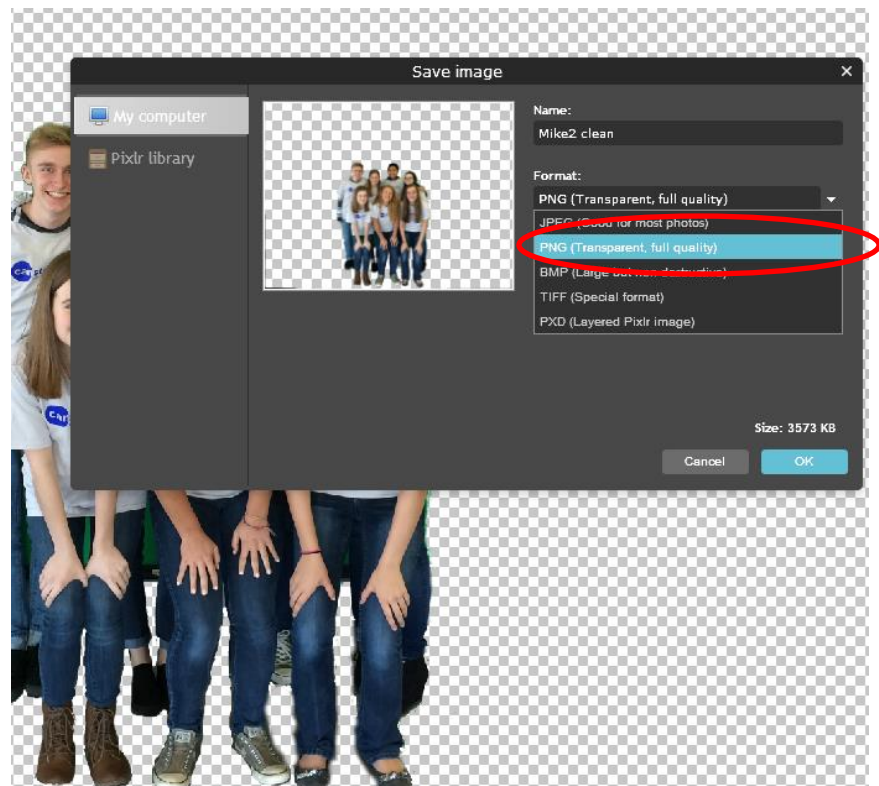


31. Be sure to save as a .png so the background stays transparent.

32. Click OK

33. Choose where you want it saved.

34. Close Pixlr.



STEP 2 ADDING IT TO THE BACKGROUND

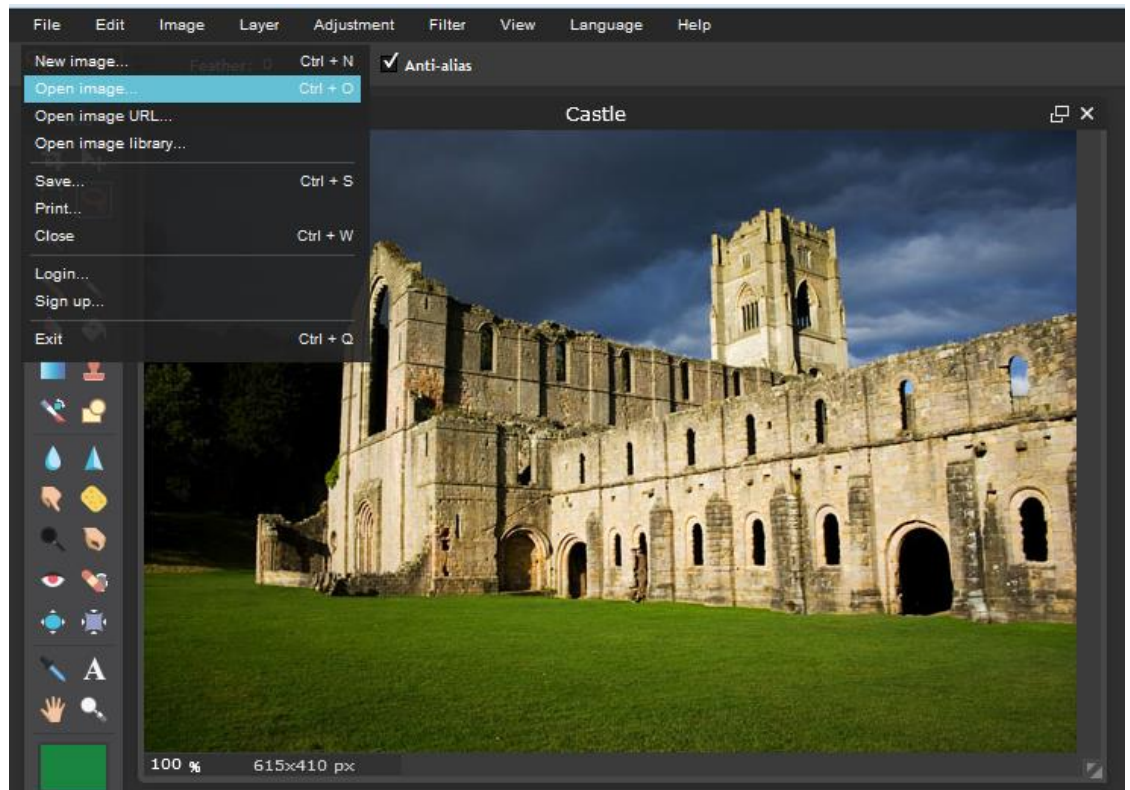
35. Open Pixlr Web App again (Steps #3 – 5)

36. Choose Open Image from Computer (Step 6)

37. Choose your background picture this time.

38. Unlock the background (Step #20)

39. Choose File –
Open Image to
get your
foreground picture

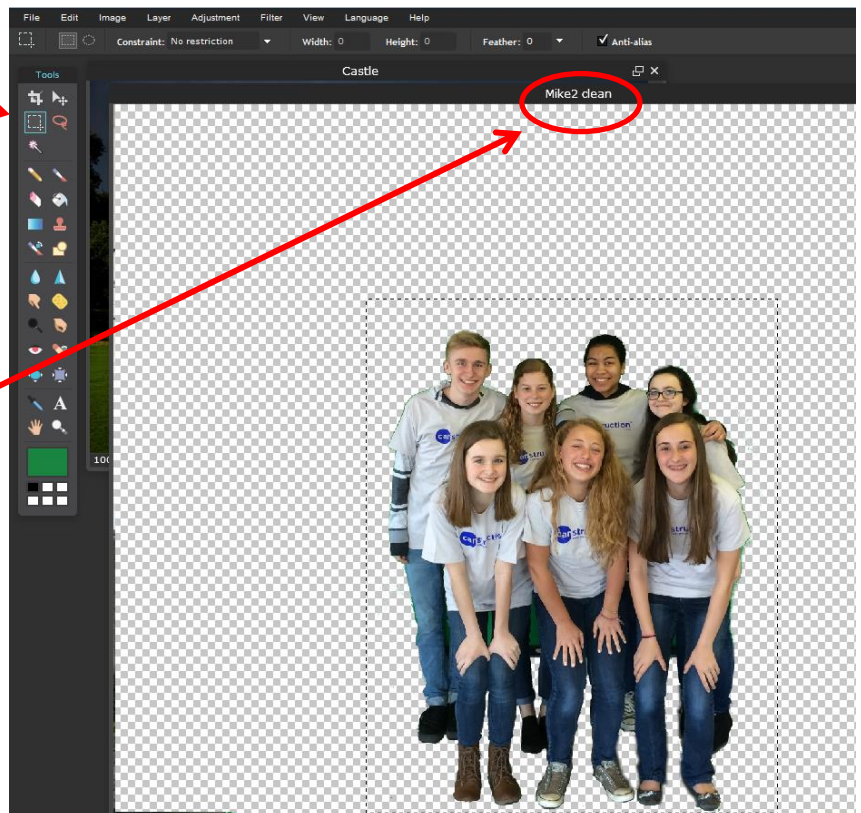


It will open on top of your background picture

40. Choose the
Square lasso tool

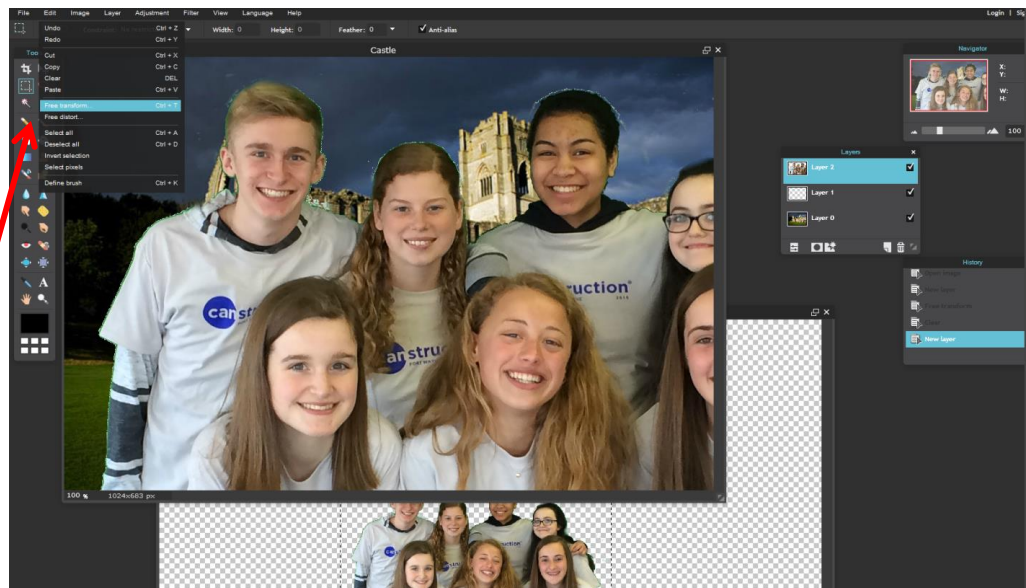


41. Click on the top left Corner of the
part you want from the foreground
and drag to the bottom right corner
42. Control C or Command C to copy it.
43. Click on the name of the foreground
at the top and drag the foreground
out of the way

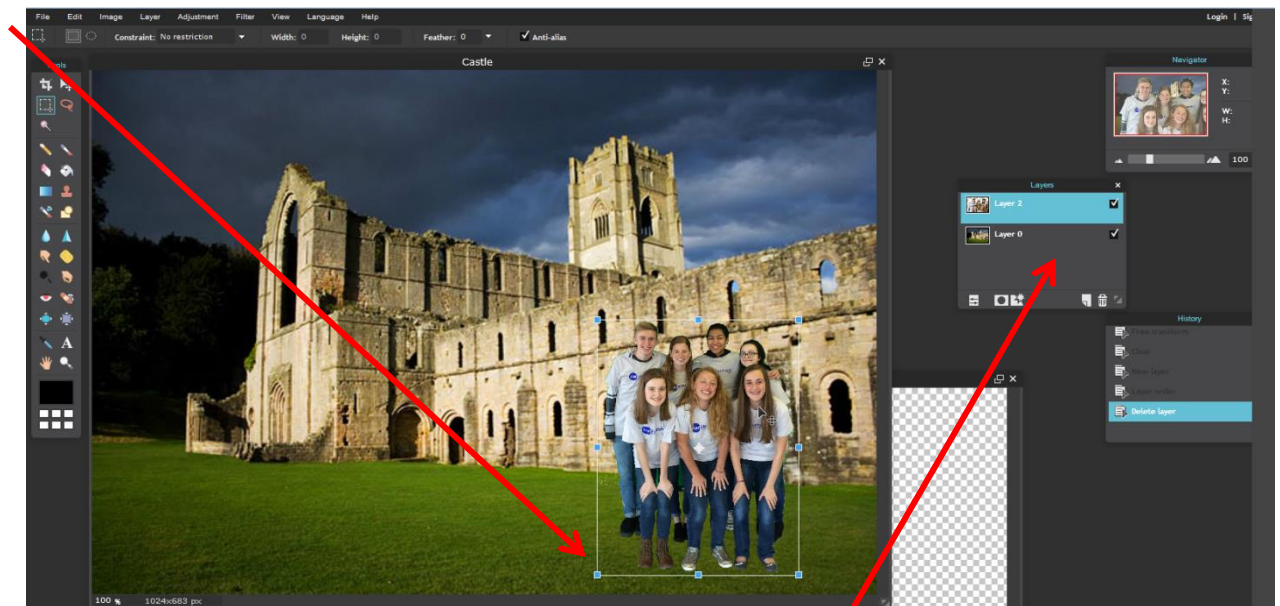


44. Click on the Background
45. Control V or Command V to paste

46. To resize or move
47. Click Edit – Free Transform



48. Use the handles to change size, location or rotation.



49. If you need to change something in a different layer use the layer toolbox to switch between layers the blue on is the one able to be edited.

50. When you have the completed look: flatten all the layers together so they save as one picture. With Layer - Flatten Image

51. File – Save
52. Close Pixlr
